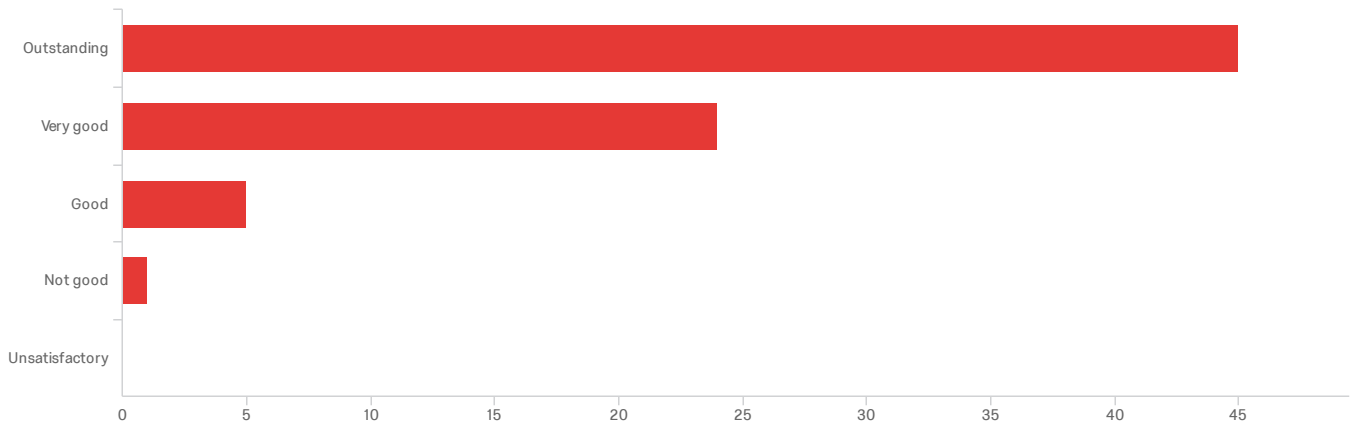

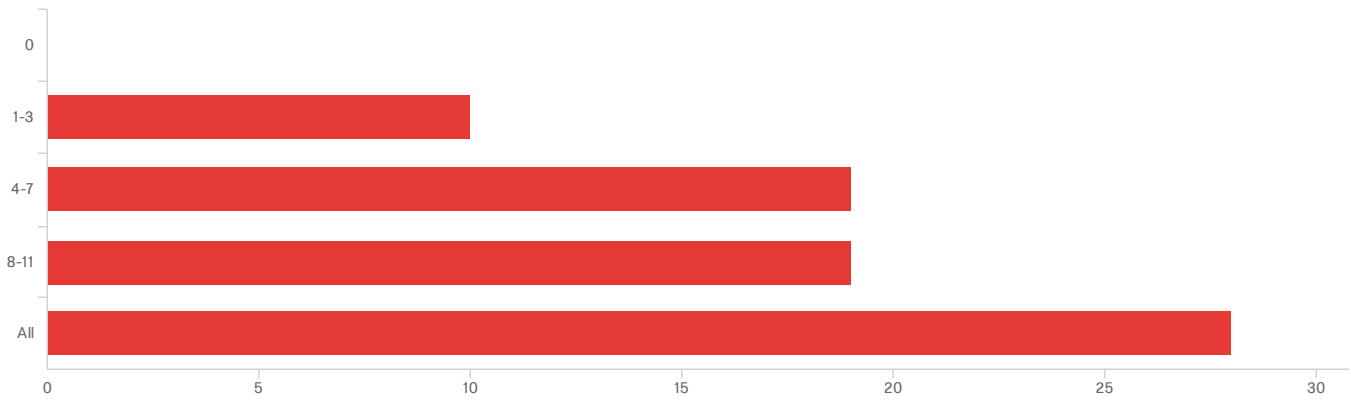

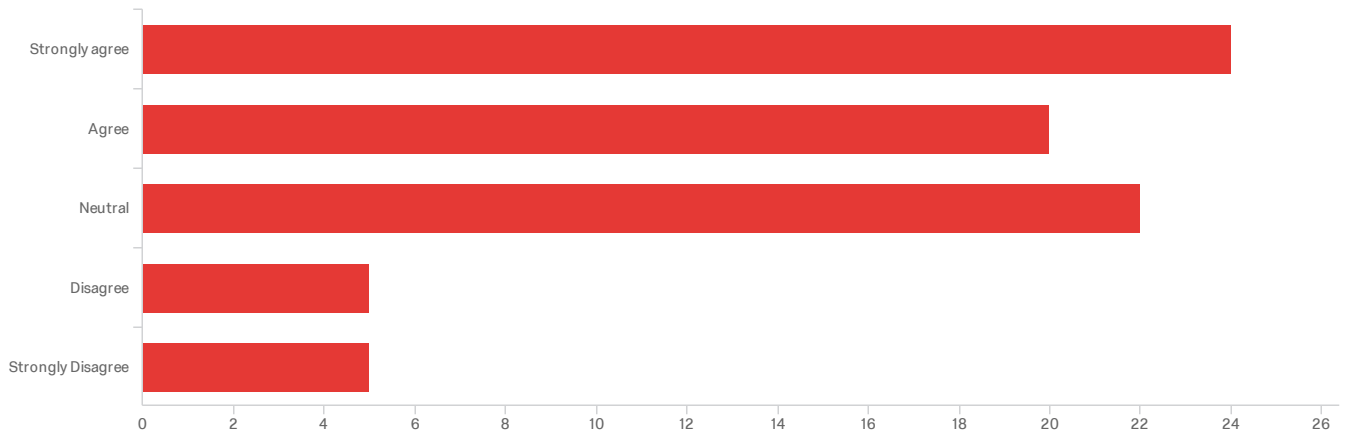
Q14 - How many online classes did you take in the MPA program?

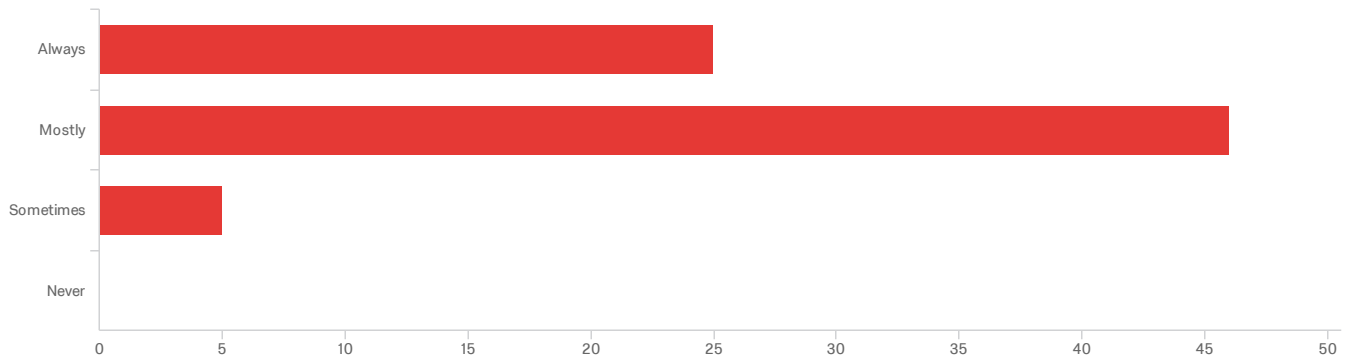
Q15 - I prefer online courses.

Q16 - Were you satisfied with the quality of the online classes?



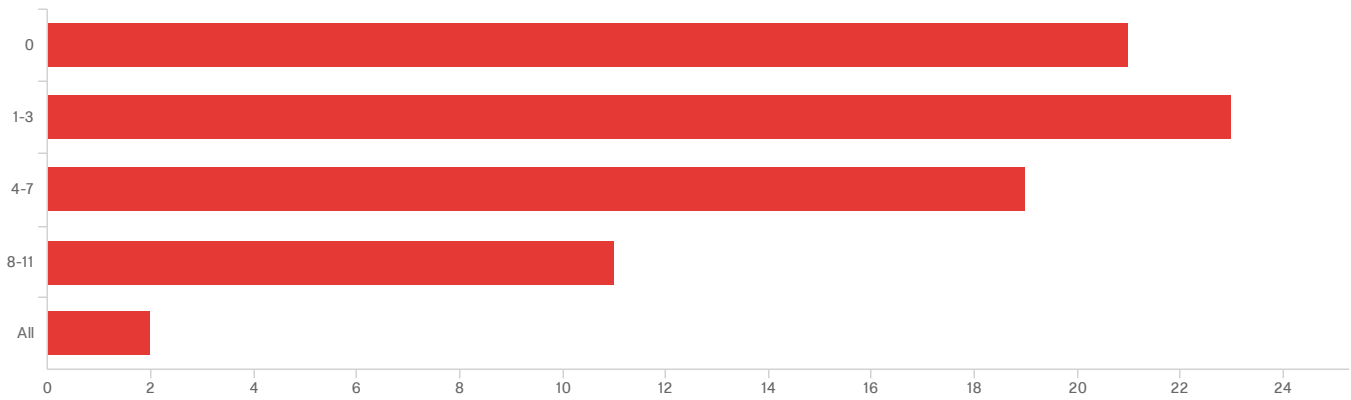

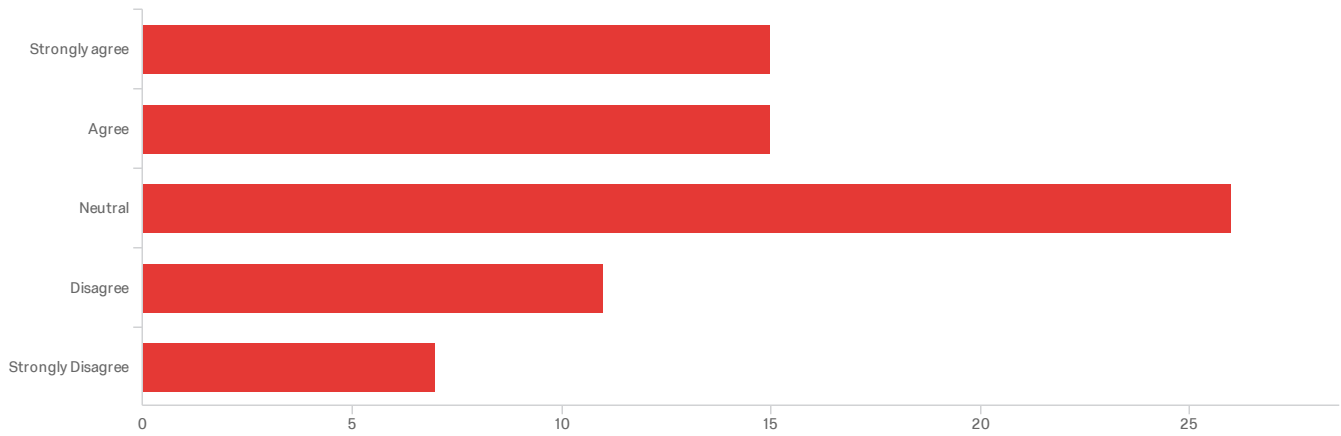
Q17 - How many face-to-face classes did you take in the MPA program?

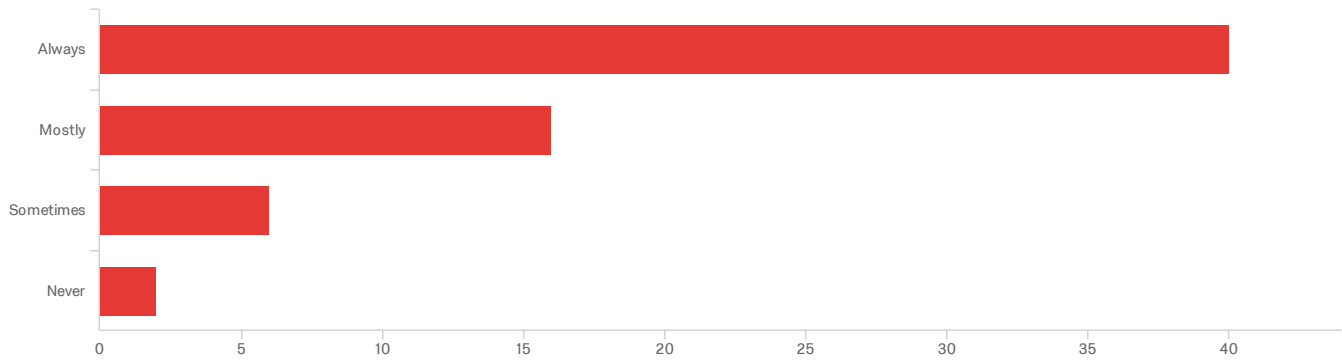
Q18 - I prefer face-to-face courses.

Online - format was pretty basic, opportunity to enhance engagement methods

The online classes are too fast paced.

I love this program so much. My favorite professors were Dr. Silard and Dr. Baker!

Some online classes were difficult to follow along with. In 2 of them, I did not receive feedback or grades on assignments in a timely manner which is very inconvenient and stressful.

Hybrid courses where an online student can be a part of a face to face class would help engagement.

I prefer both face to face and online classes.

Online classes were difficult but provided a lot of interaction with your classmates

Having the ability, as a working adult, to take the entire program online was key to my decision to attend CSUSB. The quality of instruction and commitment of instructors was every bit as good as face to face courses

Although the online classes were the most convenient, I did not prefer them. I felt as though my learning experience suffered. I loved my face to face classes because it was a great learning environment which promoted discussion, it wasn't forced like in many of my online classes. Unfortunately I have a full time and family obligations that prevented me from taking more face to face classes.

Online course quality GREATLY varied by the professors understanding of technology and comfort level. There was not much consistency. I can't recall any course that was terrible but Dr Anderson used technology very well and I took his diversity course early and unfortunately nobody else lived up to that standard. I would say that I believe it was Professor VanWart who has the worst utilization of technology - talking over still slides that looked ancient was very tough to be involved in the topic. So having more consistency would be very helpful to ensure that we have the opportunity to be engaged as we would in a face to face class.

I learned more in the face to face classes but working full time did not allow me to take those often

I didn't care for the online classes that required Zoom sessions. If I am taking an online class it's because I can't have a set schedule. I feel that needs to be evaluated again.

I like the interactivity and engagement created by the Zoom sessions, especially as an all online student

I enjoyed the face to face classes more but I was working full-time so online classes were more convenient for me. I did not like the PA 650 online course because there was a lot of information new to me and it was difficult to understand some concepts, for that class I had to do extra research and I also watched YouTube videos that helped me understand the concept better.

In general I think that most professors do not put enough effort to make their classes engaging and interesting.

The quality range was quite high in terms of content and methods.

Please provide any comments on the quality of online or face to face classe...

Online courses were great, other than when we had experienced CSUSB system issues or technical difficulties. Face to face classes are not my preference because of work and driving to campus, it was more difficult to rearrange life to accommodate physical classes. Whereas online courses allowed for flexibility to manage your schedule around specific deadlines, no driving, no traffic, no parking, no late nights on campus. Late night work or early morning work done in the comfort of your home or at work before or after hours.

Always interactive

Not having to drive from High Desert to campus is my sole reason for preferring online versus face to face. I feel that the quality of the classes was very similar, with the advantage that I think online students felt more relaxed to engage because they were in their own homes. From the instructor perspective, both in person and online they were engaging.

Due to full-time employment status, the amount of face-to-face classes were adequate and it was great to see the professors of the quarter in person to establish rapport.

The hybrid classes were great!

The quality of online classes largely depended on the level of engagement the professor had, such as updating content and technology so that classes could be more interactive (such as implementing ZOOM).

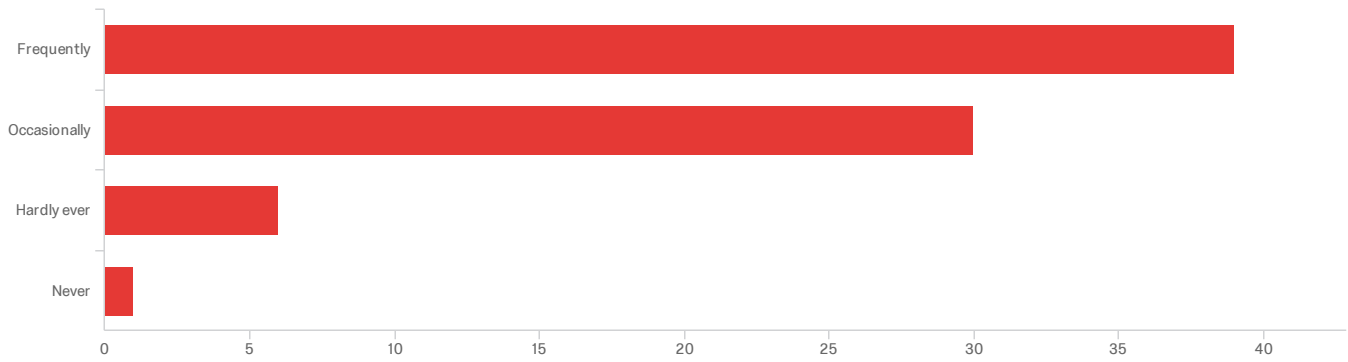

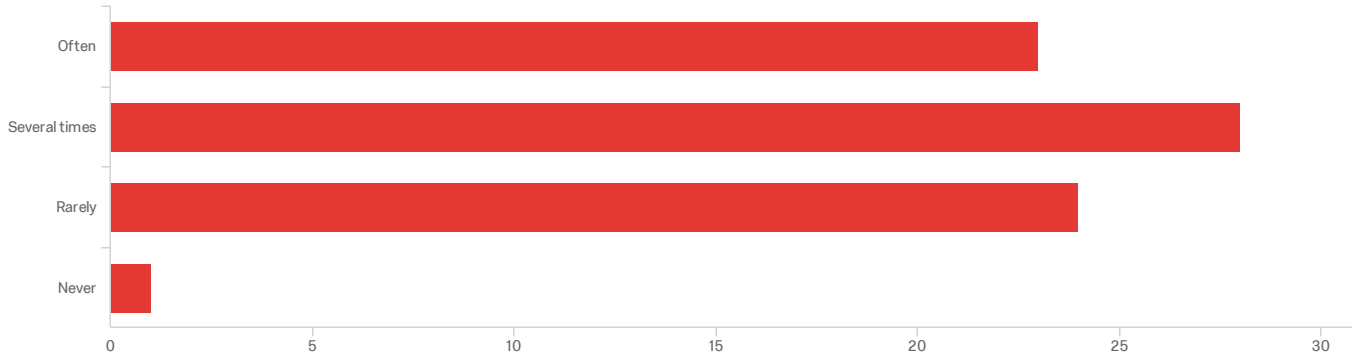

Q26 - During your MPA program, did you contact the graduate adviser or PA office for assistance?

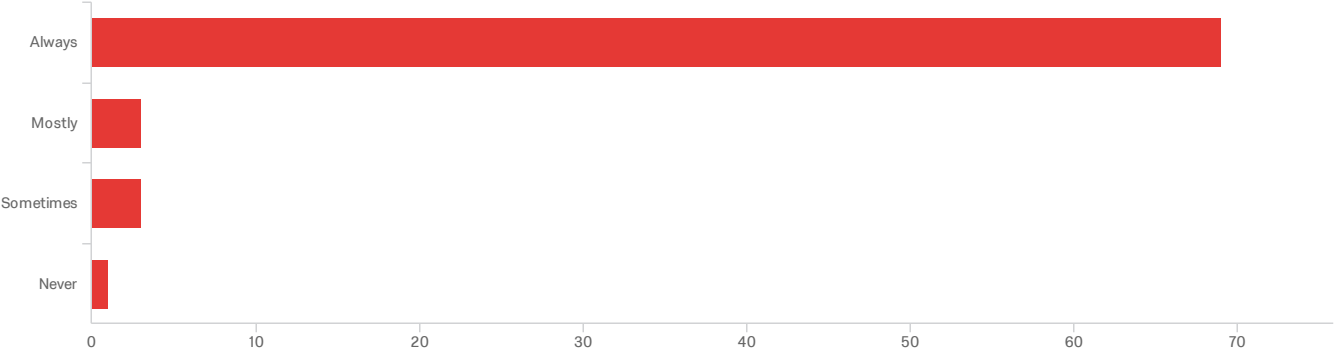

Q27 - Were your questions answered?

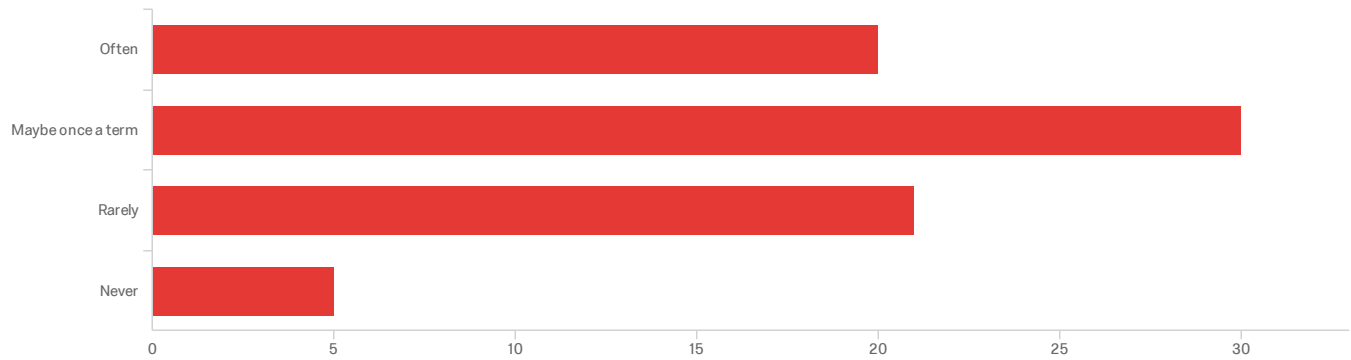

Q28 - During your MPA program did you contact your instructor outside of class?

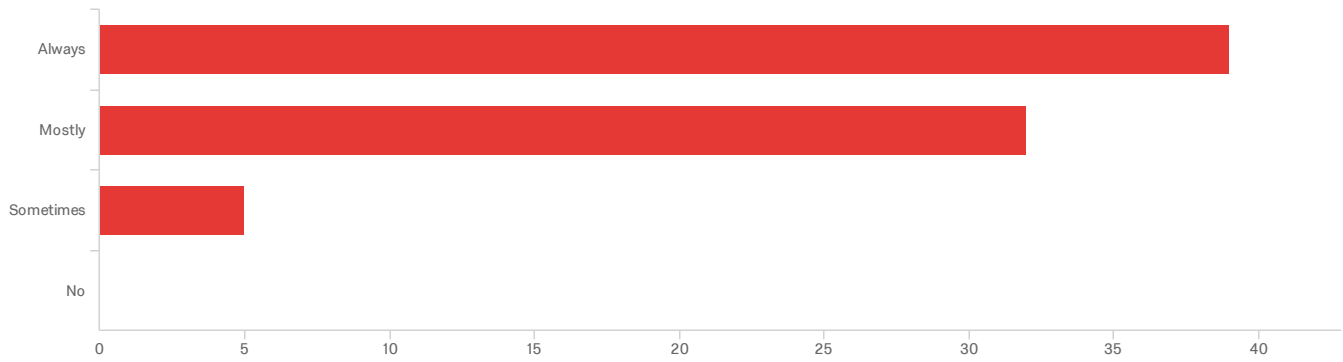

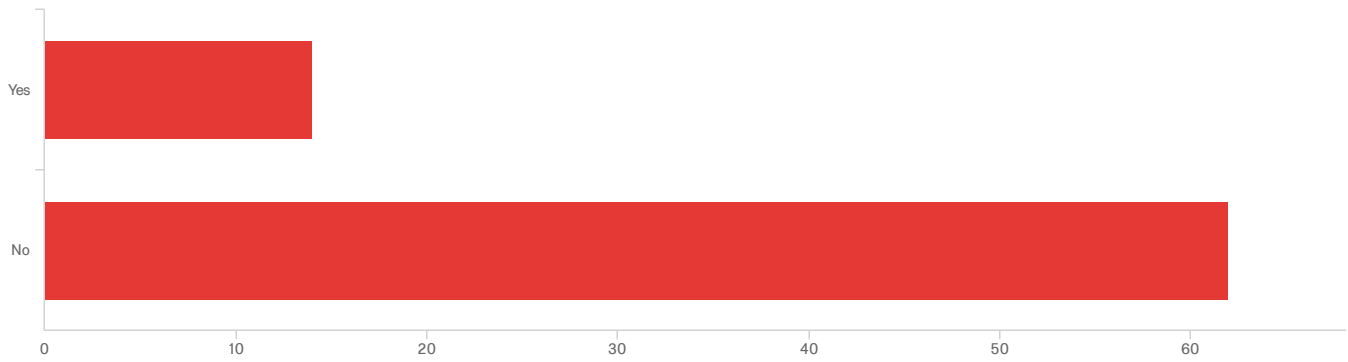

Q31 - Did you complete an internship during your MPA program?

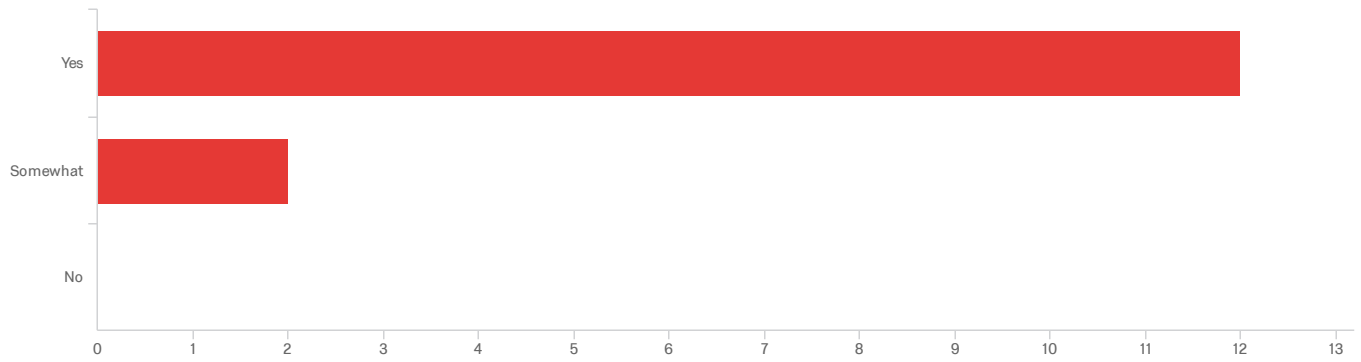

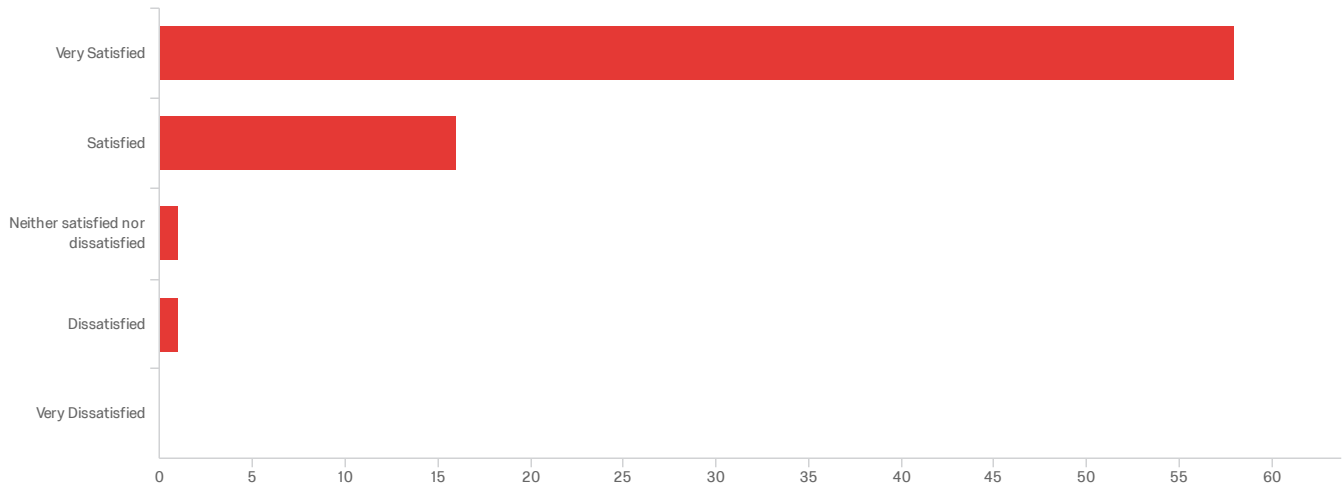

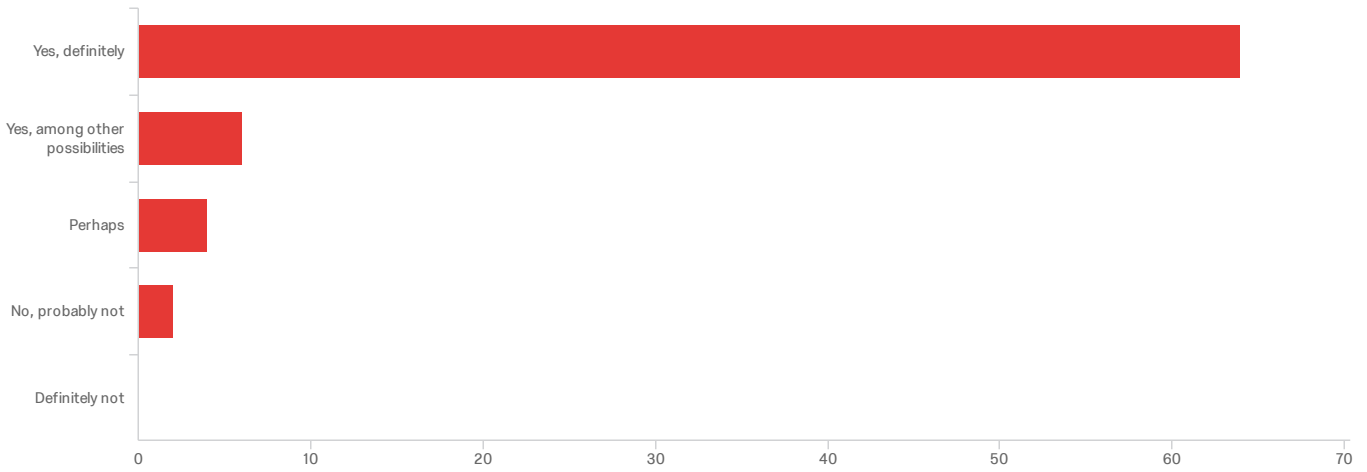
Q40 - Overall Impressions of the MPA Program How would you rate your overall level of satisfaction with the education you received in the MPA Program?

More electives could be offered

Convince Dr. Baker out of retirement.

More involvement with GIS and data science.

Expanding ways for students to engage with faculty and peers (online students)

Offer interesting PA summer courses abroad in foreign countries.

Really need more on-line courses. Got to be difficult at end. Really would like to see a broader range of electives as a lot of electives seemed tailored more to local government.

My experience was amazing and I am a proud graduate of the program and of the campus. Two constructive observations: 1- the timelines, or actually lack of from some faculty in grading submissions at times left me a third or more into the quarter before knowing how I was tracking in meeting the faculty expectations. 2- The career planning website is in dire need of rework. There is old technology (Flash) and often there were errors in videos loading. I heard this from other students as well. Lastly, having this at the very end of the process, leaves no means for students to really obtain follow up on their submissions.

The only recommendation would be additional training in the online environment for some of the lecturers, and possibly better recording equipment as there were some sound issues in a few courses.

During my time I have seen many improvements including the addition of a Non-profit certificate, I would like to see it as a concentration in the MPA program in the future.

I appreciate the PA 99 career requirement are really great, even for those of us who are already working. I think that it would have been helpful to expand those throughout the entire program or at least encourage people to check into the resources that are available. As an online student I cant keep up with all my CSUSB emails from the many departments so if Dr Anderson or the staff just mentioned the opportunities every once in a while that would be nice. Also many professors need some development on their technological capabilities - wasnt terrible for the most part but many could greatly improve.

More variety of electives offered online

Allow students to see the schedule of classes for their last academic year before having them complete the advancement to candidacy to reduce the possibility of students making changes to their program plan.

I will leave this to current administration, faculty and staff as you are all doing an excellent job.

I think the PA office should have a drop off box or mailbox. I worked full-time Monday through Friday and it was hard for me to get documents signed by Dr. Anderson because I could not make it. I think that the process to add the PA 999 class, through the extended learning, should change to help full-time working adults.

Practice what you preach. If you advise the students to have interesting presentations then it would be beneficial if the faculty also made their lectures and presentations interesting and engaging. People learn from what you do not what you say.

Offer more events around working hours as most students work during the day. And expand the info you provide online on your website.

I appreciate the offerings that focus on the nonprofit sector. I'd like to see CSUSB lead in this academic area

The beginning of the course should emphasize a senior project as well as the comp. exam.

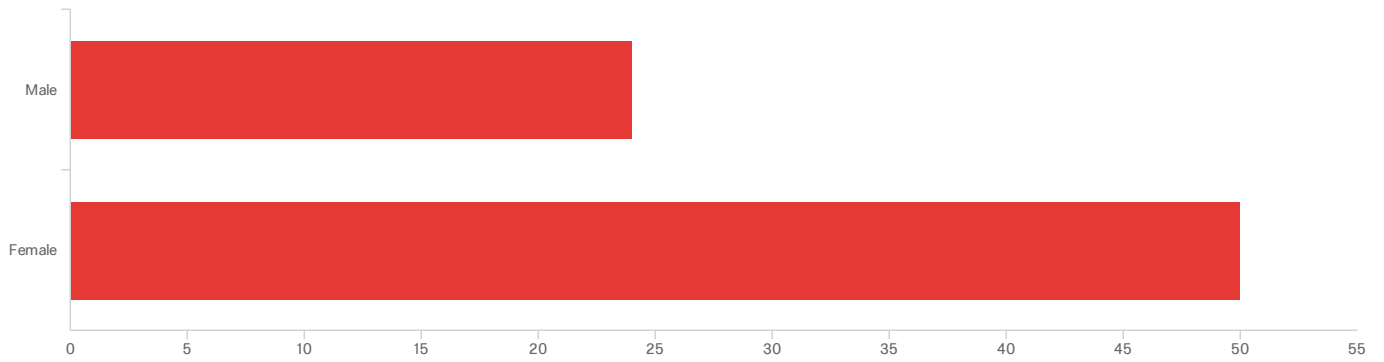

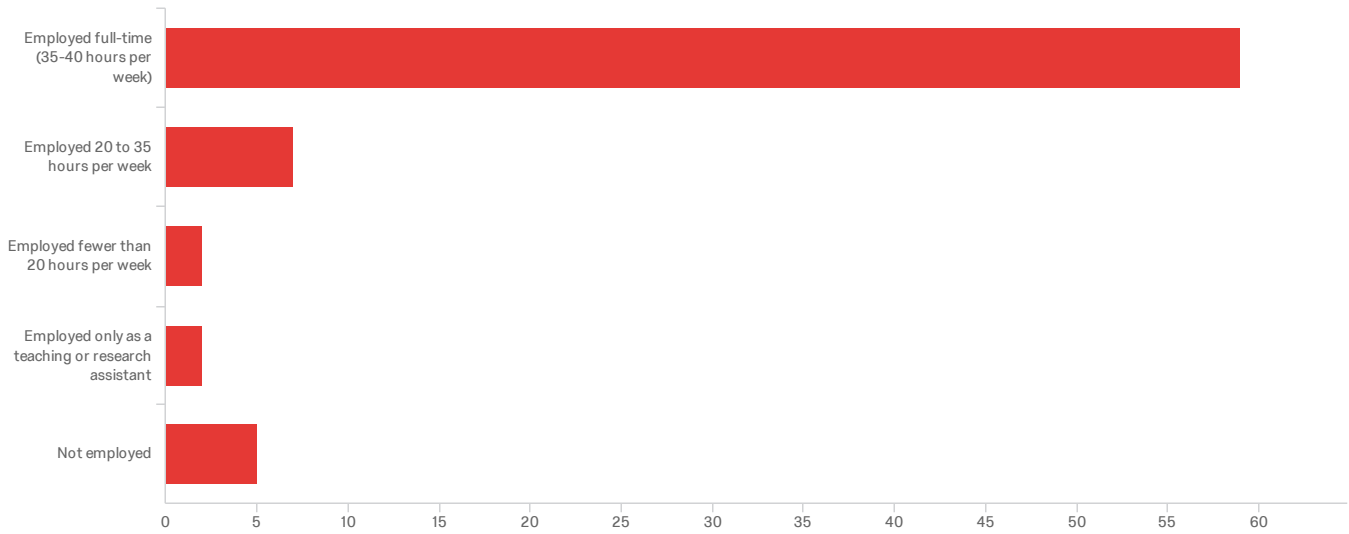
Q48 - What was your student status while you were in the MPA prog

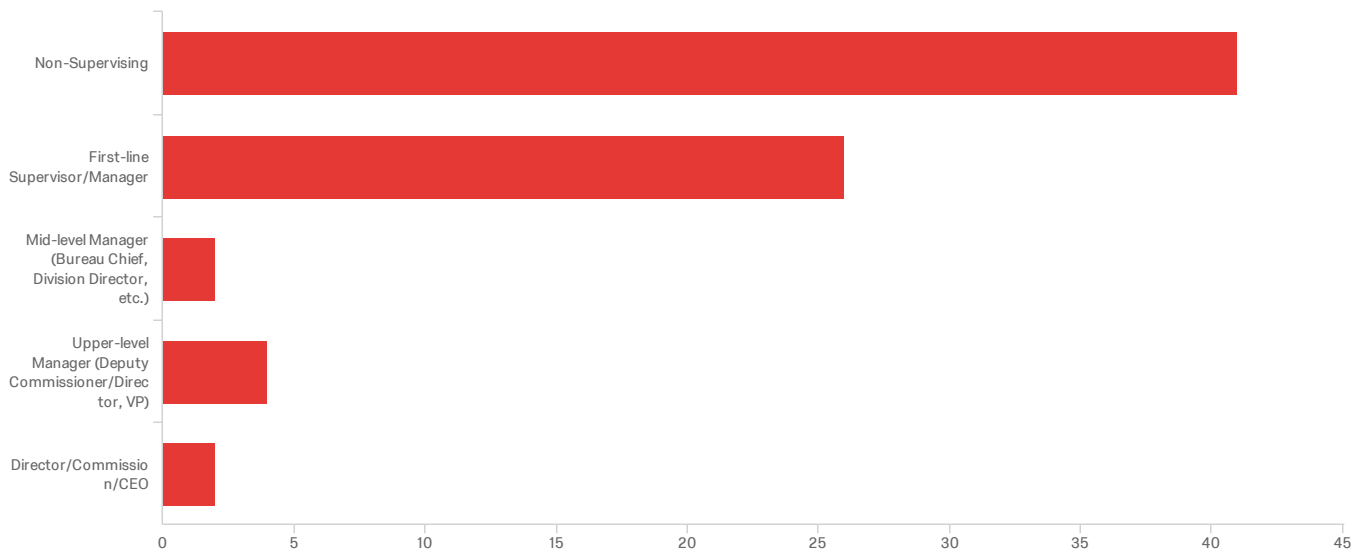
Q49 - Which of the following best describes your employment status when you began the MPA program?

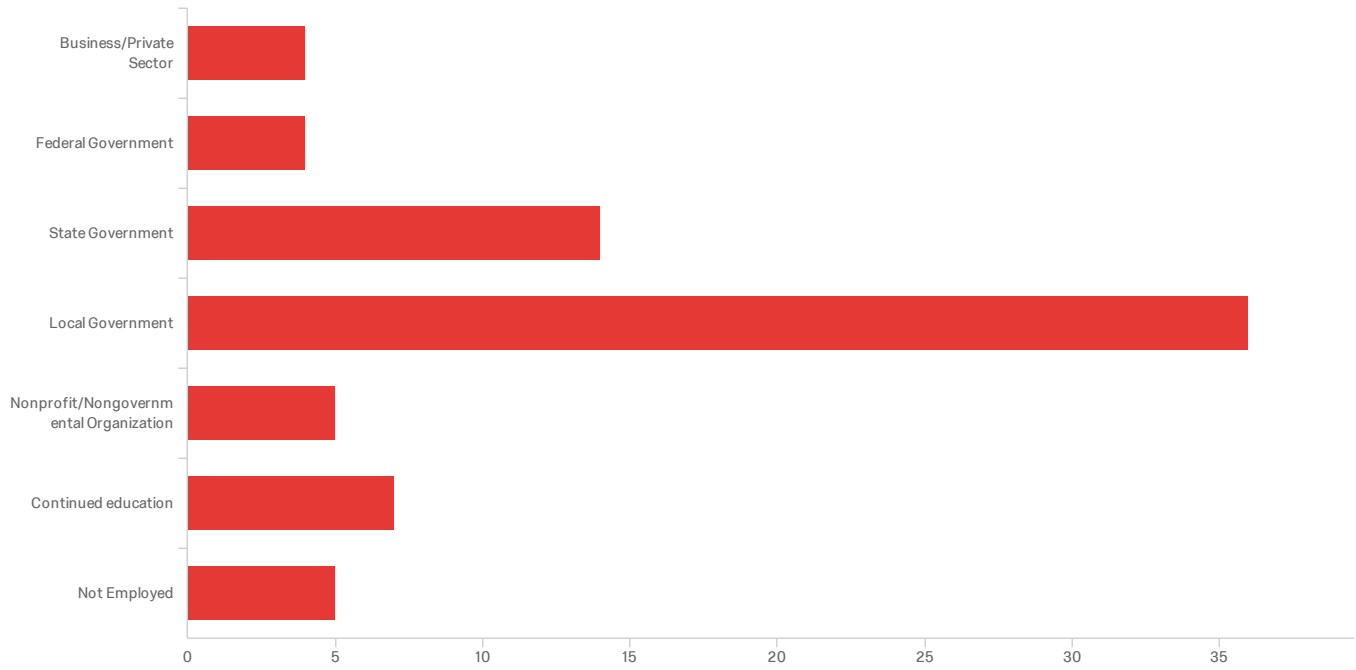
Q50 - Where does your current job fit in your organization's hierarchy?

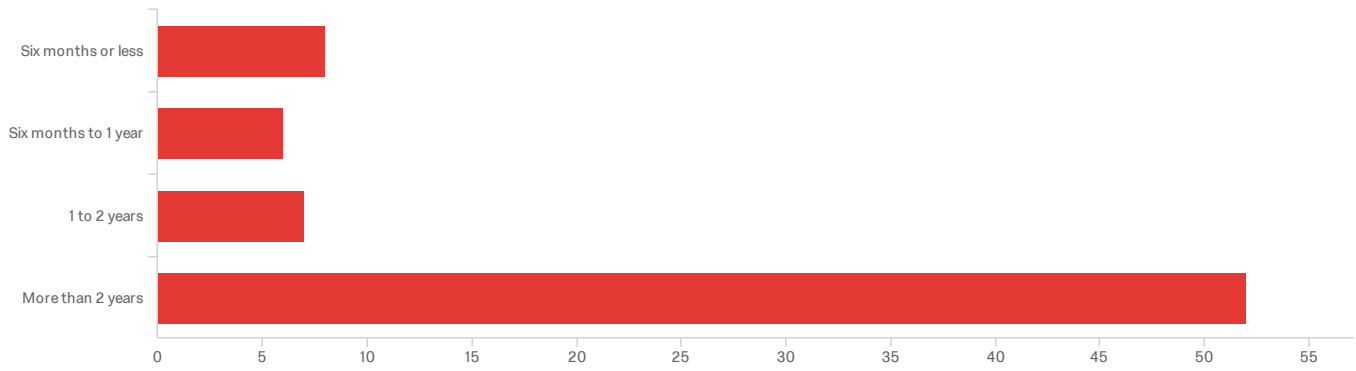
Q51 - Which of the following sectors best describes your current primary work or source of income?

Q52 - How long have you been employed in this position?

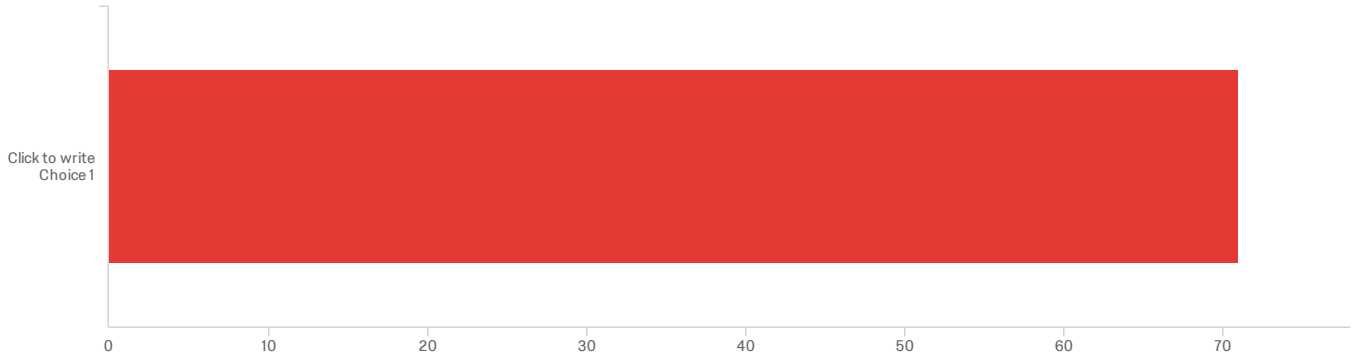

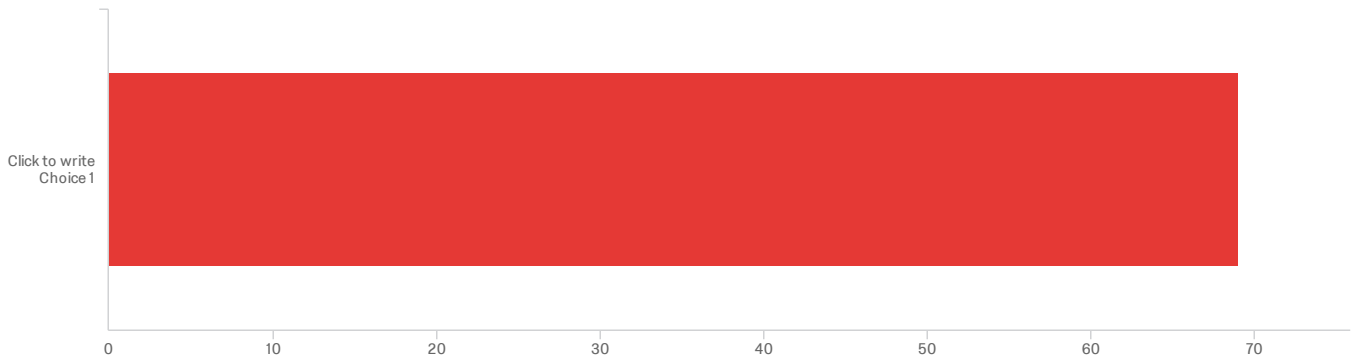
