
Personal Identity Wheel


Fill out the following wheel to describe yourself! What are things that you might have in common with those around you? What are components that might be different?

Ethnicity	Anglo, Dutch, African-American, Chicanx, Cuban, French, Lakota, Navajo, Irish, Puerto Rican, German, etc.			
Sexual Orientation	Heterosexual, Bisexual, Gay, Queer, Lesbian, Pansexual, Questioning			
Religion or Spiritual Affiliation	Christian, Jewish, Muslim, Hindu, Bahai'l, Agnostic, Atheist, Two-Spirit			
Socioeconomic Status	Owning Class, Upper Class, Middle Class, Working Class, Poor			
Age	Young Adults, Middle Age Adults, Adolescents, Child, Senior/Elder			
Gender	Man, Woman, Transgender, Gender Queer, Non-Binary			
Sex	Male, Female, Non-Binary, Intersex			
National Origin	United States, Japan, Korea, Ireland, Mexico, Dominican Republic, Canada			
Physical/Psychological Mental/Learning Ability	Able Bodied, Living with a Disability, Living with Chronic Disease
