They will learn of youtube channels that they may watch and follow activities such as dancing, stretching, yoga etc.

With modules that will with organization, class selections, and career exploration. This program will help students set and reach goals.

They will understand that routines and schedules in middle school differ from those in elementary school. Students will understand that their days will consist of periods and transitions to different classes as well as communicating with different teachers. Students will be encouraged to join extracurricular activities to become involved in the school they will be attending.
3. Summer Academic Programs	12th	<u>Summer June/July</u>	CSUSB, University of Redlands, UCR	Summer Bridge	designed to help students make the transition from high school to college. Examples of activities include orientation to the campus, Mathematics and English refresher courses, assistance with logistical student issues (such as college fees, financial aid, parking permits or bus passes, photo IDs, etc.), introduction to campus programs (such as Honors program, Study Abroad, EOP&S, and MESA), and peer mentoring.

Students will receive an instruction on what components they should focus on. They will have the time to begin or edit their answers as well as brainstorm while having advisors and peers review their progress.

Students will create an account on studentaid.gov and fill out the application for the appropriate school year. The sessions should start off with demonstrations of how to navigate the student aid website.
5. Financial Aid Awareness & Planning	12th Grade	<u>Fall</u> <u>October</u> <u>February</u>	Cal-SOAP, Blu Foundation	Cash for College: Dream Act	12th grade students will understand how to apply for the Dream Act. They will have the opportunity to begin/submit their application.
5. Financial Aid Awareness & Planning	11th Grade	<u>Spring</u> <u>March</u>	Cal-SOAP, Blu Foundation	What is FAFSA?	11th grade students will learn what FAFSA is. They will understand the types of FAFSA that is available to them. They will be able to explain to peers what type of student loans there are (unsubsidized, subsidized, parent plus loan), grants (Cal grant A, B, C, pell grant). Students will also learn what DACA is. In addition they will also have an understanding of work study and scholarships

Financial Aid Awareness & Planning	11th Grade	<u>Spring</u> <u>April</u>	Cal-SOAP, Blu Foundation	What are Scholarships?	11th grade students will be able to create an account on a scholarship finding website (e.g career cruising, niche.com, fastweb.com) They will be allowed the time to browse through the lists of scholarships that are available. They may favorite, or even start applying for ones that interest them. Students will understand that there are many scholarships available.

Financial Aid Awareness	Students and Families	Fall & Spring <u>September</u> <u>March</u>	Cal-SOAP, FIS	Cash for College: Preparing for College	Participants should become more informed and learn of the terms and tools that exist when finding ways to pay for college. They will learn of FAFSA, Dream Act, Scholarships, Chaffee grant, Cal Grants, Loans etc. This workshop will make college searches easier.
5. Financial Aid Awareness	12th	Spring <u>May</u>	Cal-SOAP	Cash for College: Read Financial Award Letter	12th grade students will learn the important components of their financial award letter. They will understand that universities tend to inflate the cost of attendance and that there are fees that don't apply directly to the university. Students may schedule 1:1 advising sessions to better understand their letters.

Students will receive a demonstration on how to navigate the application and how the application process works.
