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Cal State San Bernardino accepting undergraduate applications for spring 2025

PALM DESERT, Calif. - Cal State San Bernardino, including its Palm Desert Campus, is now accepting undergraduate applications from first-time, upper-division transfer, and returning students for spring 2025.

For students who have missed the fall application window, this provides another opportunity to attend CSUSB. Applications will be accepted through Sept. 15.

Classes start in January and will fill up quickly, so students are encouraged to register early. Students can apply to any non-impacted major, psychology and criminal justice. However, nursing, kinesiology, allied health, and social work are still impacted and will not be accepting applications. To apply for spring 2025, visit the Cal State Apply webpage.

A variety of <u>financial aid opportunities</u> are available, and students who qualify can take advantage of a \$1,000 grant for newly enrolled spring 2025 students.
