# Recruitment and Outreach – Caroline Vickers and Erma Cross (12:20 pm)

The Southern California Conference on Undergraduate Research (SCURR) will include a graduate school fair; graduate programs are encouraged to sign up for a table. About 1000 people are expected to attend. SCURR will be held on November 23<sup>rd</sup>.

Graduate Studies has created a Graduate Recruitment Guide, a template for a PowerPoint Presentation, and a list of talking points on the value of graduate school. Graduate Studies is also conducting <u>Cal State Apply</u> workshops and attending Graduate School Fairs.

# Cal State Apply and Enrollment Updates - Caroline Vickers and Chris Songsittichok (12:35)

Fall 2024 enrollment for graduate programs is up across the board. Enrollment numbers are in the agenda packet. Note that the data includes those students who are enrolled in continuous enrollment courses – these numbers are not recorded by Institutional Research. Reasons for enrollment increase include the addition of new programs, an increase in credential applicants, and an increase in enrollment among California residents. The number of international students decreased, but these students may enroll at a later term.

Please use the email feature in WebAdmit to reach out to in-progress applicants to inquire if they need assistance. Graduate Studies will also follow up with them.

# **Graduate Enrollment Dashboard – Chris Songsittichok (12:45)**

Chris reviewed the tools available on the Graduate Enrollment Dashboard on the Graduate Studies website. The dashboard shows the total number of program applications, admitted students, enrolled students, and allows graduate coordinators to compare semesters and identify trends.

# PAWS/EFA/myCAP for Grad Students – Caroline Vickers (1:00 p.m.)

Students who were admitted after Fall 2022 must be advanced to candidacy through PAWS. See April if you need training with PAWS or myCAP. Rachel Loverock is also a great resource. If you find that a student's PAWS report is missing, it may meant that the student broke enrollment.

The EAB program does not work well for advising graduate students because it pulls the entire academic record. Caroline is working with the Registrar's office to resolve the issue.

Eleanor Perry, (International Admissions) asked graduate coordinators to keep in mind that international students must be enrolled in in-person or hybrid courses each semester. She also asked graduate coordinators to continue to reach out to international applicants who had to defer their enrollment due to issues with obtaining a visa in time for fall semester. Eleanor defined CPT, which allows students to work off-campus through internships, and OPT, a post-graduation work opportunity for up to 3 years for STEM majors. # Thesis, Project, and Dissertation Deadlines – Shelby Reeder (1:10 PM)

Shelby Reeder reviewed the deadlines for fall submission – see the agenda materials for fall and spring deadlines and workshops. Shelby clarified that thesis reviews during winter intersession would not be possible due to campus closures; this may affect international students.
