Minors and Certificates

MINOR IN BORDER STUDIES (18 units). Interdisciplinary minor focused on policies, perceptions, and practices related to the U.S./Mexico Border.

MINOR IN DISABILITY STUDIES (18 units). Interdisciplinary minor introducing the field of disability studies, which centers the knowledge, contributions, experiences, and cultures of people with disabilities.

MINOR IN ENGLISH TEACHER PREPARATION (24 units). Recommended for students planning to obtain a single subject teaching credential in language arts (for teaching English at the high school level).

MINOR IN MULTIMEDIA STORYTELLING (18 units). Interdisciplinary minor that explored the use of text, photography, video, audio, and graphics in the act of storytelling. Applicable to multiple careers.
