The CSU and CSUSB have mobilized to stand with our students. We will continue to share updated policies, resources, and support initiatives on this matter throughout the semester.

For now, I encourage you to take two actions:

First, review our <u>Immigration Enforcement Response</u>. This plan outlines how our university responds to any presence of immigration enforcement officials on the San Bernardino or Palm Desert campus. This site will be continually updated. Additionally, event times to discuss and review this plan are forthcoming.

Second, attend the upcoming UndocuaAlly Workshop on Monday, March 17, from 12-1 p.m. via Zoom. Practical and immediate steps to support the academic success and well-being of our students will be shared. Here is the workshop Zoom link: https://csusb.zoom.us/s/89142494891

In closing, here are key points I wish to underscore:

- CSUSB will not collaborate with immigration enforcement officials unless legally required (an exceptional occurrence).
- Campus law enforcement does not and will not engage in immigration enforcement activities.
- Support services are available. Our Undocumented Student Success Center offers legal resources, mental health support, and academic advising tailored to the needs of undocumented students. The center is a resource for employees and students. It is located in Santos Manuel Student Union North, 3313.

I understand that this can be an especially difficult time for those directly affected by immigration-related concerns. Please know that CSUSB stands with you. We will continue to work towards making CSUSB a welcoming and inclusive community. Thank you for doing your part to foster a sense of belonging and security for our students and colleagues.
