# Spring PAES Retreat January Event Recap

#### Why English-Medieval Studies?

"My research has been focused on the ways the middle ages get used in popular culture, like in movies, novels, and games—especially games. Five years ago, I shifted my research to Game Studies, because I've always loved games. I decided that, pushing 50, I needed to focus on the things I love and can have lots of fun with. So, now I'm working on an article about character creation in Dungeons & Dragons".

Dr. Marshall has a collection of about 300 board games, 60 different TTRGs, & a collection of about 18,000 cards from Magic: The Gathering! He also loves to write & is currently writing a memoir that draws on science fiction and magical realism to talk about the effects childhood trauma had on his life.

"I thought about being an oceanographer, a marine biologist, an actor/singer, a philosopher, a photographer, a war correspondent photojournalist, a linguist, a writer/poet, and even a monk. "I am looking forward to running programs and activities that allow me to spend time with Honors students. More than anything, I'd like that to happen. I've started the 'Get Inspired!' documentary series, I plan to start a tabletop games group, and I have some special projects that I actually need students' help with. One of them involves making a short film that features as many Easter eggs that refer to Ryan Reynolds & Hugh Jackman as possible. The other thing I am eager to do is continue building the Honors program"

"The current political situation in our country deeply troubles me. Nevertheless, I follow Paolo Freire in believing that a key purpose of education is to empower people who have been disempowered to advocate and fight for their communities."

#### Current Exciting Projects?

"My goal is to build an Honors college. I began in July of 2015 and I will finish it. In my research, I'm excited to be working on a study of how roleplaying games have leveraged character creation processes to induce an immersive experience in players. My research partner, a grad student named Megan Haynes, and I are interested in how having players identify with and immerse into their characters might leave them open to behaviors or belief systems that are problematic. Personally, I'm taking that research and turning towards a different purpose. I am working on developing a game studies program at CSUSB. My thought is that we might teach students how games work, how to design them, and then create a group who tries to develop and market small games that require players to question their beliefs".

#### Piece of Advice for Honors Students


"Be Bloody, bold, and resolute." From Macbeth







